POWER UPDATE

(Philadelphians Organized to Witness, Empower & Rebuild) www.powerinterfaith.org

Airport Breakthrough: On the eve of the Democratic National Convention, POWER played an important role in a major labor dispute. POWER has been in steady dialogue and solidarity with low-wage, mostly African-American and Latino baggage handlers and wheelchair operators at Philadelphia International Airport over the past 3 years, supporting their appeals to American Airlines to require sub-contractors to pay them a living wage and allow workers to organize. On July 21, 13 POWER clergy and laity came to the airport in support of the workers and were briefly but very publicly arrested when airline executives refused to meet with them. The next day, state and city officials convinced airline ex-ecutives to negotiate with the workers, thus averting a strike and honoring the dignity of the workers. It's clear the courageous action by people of faith helped create this "tipping point" toward justice. This is what "faith in action" looks like!

Simplicity

This is the virtue St. Vincent loved most. "It is my gospel," he says. Listen to how St. Vincent describes simplicity: "Jesus, the Lord, expects us to have the simplicity of a dove. This means giving a straightforward opinion about things in the way we honestly see them, without needless reservations. It also means doing things without any double-dealing or manipulation, our intention being focused solely on God. Each of us, then, should take care to behave always in this spirit of simplicity, remembering that God likes to deal with the simple, and that he conceals the secrets of heaven from the wise and prudent of this world and reveals them to little ones.

But while Christ recommends the simplicity of a dove he tells us to have the prudence of a serpent as well. What he means is that we should speak and behave with discretion. We ought, therefore, to keep quiet about matters which should not be made known, especially if they are unsuitable or unlawful ... In actual practice this virtue is about choosing the right way to do things." (CR 11, 4-5.

Humility

Jesus said "Learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart." Humility is basic to gospel spirituality. The kingdom of God belongs to the poor in spirit. God resists the proud; he raises up the humble. We must stand before God humbly in our daily prayer, and have the attitude of a servant.

Fr. Tolton was the first American diocesan priest of African descent. Born the son of slaves in Missouri, he studied for the priesthood in Rome, as no American seminary would accept him because of his race. Ordained in 1886 for the Diocese of Alton, Illinois, he served his first three years as a priest in the city of Quincy, of the same diocese. He later came to Chicago to start a parish for black Catholics, serving in the Archdiocese of Chicago until his passing. 
