WHAT is R.U.M.?

The mission of the Reconciliation & Unity Ministry (RUM) is to foster our "becoming One Body of Christ" as a parish community where all are welcome - across races, generations, sexual orientations, countries of origin, and Mass preferences - to encounter Christ's loving presence in each other.

RUM began in the aftermath of the national trauma generated by the death of Michael Brown in Ferguson in 2014, when Fr Sy invited a diverse group of parishioners to come together to reflect on what our times called us to be and do as a parish community. In its first two years, RUM initiated the Pew Conversations to encourage dialogue among parishioners about the meaning of the Gospel for our lives. RUM also launched Movie Nights, bringing us together to think about pressing and potentially divisive issues like racism, homophobia, and immigration. RUM's main purpose is to encourage our many ministries - from liturgy to social justice - to use "becoming One" as a central guide for their work.

RUM members commit to meeting together monthly, and following up on "homework" that arises between meetings, to talk, plan or collaborate with members of other ministries or external groups about ideas raised in RUM. And we have a one-day retreat coming up on **Saturday, January 14** for all old and new RUM members, so save that date! Interested? Want to know more, and maybe join us? 
Homeless Memorial Day

Prayer and Fasting

(December 19th to 23rd)

We are praying for unity and acceptance of all people. We are praying that we become an even more welcoming parish to all, especially those on the “fringe”.

1. Please pray this every day.
 2. Any form of prayer you like.
 - a. Listening to God
 - b. Eucharistic Devotion
 - c. Mass
 - d. Rosary
 - e. Novena
 - f. Mantra (i.e. “God help me.”)
 - g. Speaking from heart
 - h. Form prayers
3. There is Mass at 7am each morning.
4. There is a Holy Hour, with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, each evening from 6pm to 7pm.
5. At noon each day, join us to pray for our parish, by saying an Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory be.

Fasting

We fast to grow deeper in prayer and to make sacrifices so that God can use us. There are many ways to fast, but all require some form of sacrifice to accompany our prayer. You must not fast so severely that you risk a medical issue.

The suggested fast is the Daniel Fast.

1. For those 5 days, eat only fruits, vegetables, water and pure fruit or vegetable juice. No caffeine, no alcohol, no meats, poultry or fish, no eggs or cheeses, no snacks or desserts. No eating between meals or snacks. Only one helping during meals.
2. If you cannot do this for 5 days in a row, skip a day; but avoid in between meal eating.
3. If you cannot do it for 3 days, then try 2 days or even 1.
4. If you cannot go the entire day without meat or poultry or fish, limit yourself to once a day.
5. If this is too much, do what you can. Give up snacks and desserts.

Remember we are doing this to be willing to sacrifice for God and to see the face of God in all our brothers and sisters.

Preparing the Way for the World Day of Migrants and Refugees # 2

"Child Migrants: the Vulnerable and the Voiceless" Pope Francis' Letter to Us for the World Day of Migrants, January 15th, 2017 - Part 2



As a Latin American bishop, Pope Francis is familiar with the method of "seeing, judging, and acting." In "reading the signs of the times" he has placed world migration at the center of his pastoral work. His first trip out of Rome took him to the island of Lampedusa in the Mediterranean, where thousands of migrants from Africa and the Middle East arrive in a desperate search for shelter after risking their lives. In this letter he focuses on immigrant and refugee children. In the first part he reminded us of the love Jesus had for children, saying that to welcome them is to welcome God. *"For this reason," he remarks, "on the occasion of the annual World Day of Migrants and Refugees, I feel compelled to draw attention to the reality of child migrants, especially the ones who are alone. In doing so I ask everyone to take care of the young, who in a threefold way are defenseless: they are children, they are foreigners, and they have no means to protect themselves."* Look for Part 3, the last installment, in the December 25th Bulletin.

PART TWO

Childhood, given its fragile nature, has unique and inalienable needs. Above all else, there is the right to a healthy and secure family environment, where a child can grow under the guidance and example of a father and a mother; then there is the right and duty to receive adequate education, primarily in the family and also in the school, where children can grow as persons and agents of their own future and the future of their respective countries. Indeed, in many areas of the world, reading, writing and the most basic arithmetic is still the privilege of only a few. All children, furthermore, have the right to recreation; in a word, they have the right to be children.

And yet among migrants, children constitute the most vulnerable group, because as they face the life ahead of them, they are invisible and voiceless: their precarious situation deprives them of documentation, hiding them from the world's eyes; the absence of adults to accompany them prevents their voices from being raised and heard. In this way, migrant children easily end up at the lowest levels of human degradation, where illegality and violence destroy the future of too many innocents, while the network of child abuse is difficult to break up.

How should we respond to this reality?

Firstly, we need to become aware that the phenomenon of migration is not unrelated to salvation history, but rather a part of that history. One of God's commandments is connected to it: "You shall not wrong a stranger or oppress him, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt"; "Love the sojourner therefore; for you were sojourners in the land of Egypt". This phenomenon constitutes a sign of the times, a sign that speaks of the providential work of God in history and in the human community, with a view to universal communion. While appreciating the issues, and often the suffering and tragedy of migration, as too the difficulties connected with the demands of offering a dignified welcome to these persons, the Church nevertheless encourages us to recognize God's plan. She invites us to do this precisely amidst this phenomenon, with the certainty that no one is a stranger in the Christian community, which embraces "every nation, tribe, people and tongue". Each person is precious; persons are more important than things, and the worth of an institution is measured by the way it treats the life and dignity of human beings, particularly when they are vulnerable, as in the case of child migrants.

Furthermore, we need to work towards protection, integration and long-term solutions. We are primarily concerned with adopting every possible measure to guarantee the protection and safety of child migrants, because "these boys and girls often end up on the street abandoned to themselves and prey to unscrupulous exploiters who often transform them into the object of physical, moral and sexual violence".

Moreover, the dividing line between migration and trafficking can at times be very subtle. There are many factors which contribute to making migrants vulnerable, especially if they are children: poverty and the lack of means to survive – to which are added unrealistic expectations generated by the media; the low level of literacy; ignorance of the law, of the culture and frequently of the language of host countries. All of this renders children physically and psychologically dependent. But the most powerful force driving the exploitation and abuse of children is demand. If more rigorous and effective action is not taken against those who profit from such abuse, we will not be able to stop the multiple forms of slavery where children are the victims.

Merciful God, we pray to you
for all the men, women and children
who have died after leaving their homelands
in search of a better life.

Though many of their graves bear no name,
to you each one is known, loved and cherished.
May we never forget them, but honor their sacrifice
with deeds more than words.

We entrust to you all those who have made this journey,
enduring fear, uncertainty and humiliation,
in order to reach a place of safety and hope.

Just as you never abandoned your Son
as he was brought to a safe place by Mary and Joseph,
so now be close to these, your sons and daughters,
through our tenderness and protection.

Merciful God and Father of all,
wake us from the slumber of indifference,
open our eyes to their suffering,
and free us from the insensitivity
born of worldly comfort and self-centeredness.

Inspire us, as nations, communities and individuals,
to see that those who come to our shores
are our brothers and sisters.
May we share with them the blessings
we have received from your hand,
and recognize that together, as one human family,
we are all migrants, journeying in hope to you,
our true home,
where every tear will be wiped away,
where we will be at peace and safe in your embrace.

What is the Reconciliation & Unity Ministry (RUM)?
Are you called to join us?
An Advent Invitation...

RUM was formed in 2014 following the death of Michael Brown in Ferguson, and the Ministry was tasked with exploring ways of facilitating dialogue and the development of relationships here at St. Vincent's so that "we may become One."

The ministry has sponsored several initiatives, including Pew Conversations and Movie Nights, and is now hoping to work with other parish Ministries and Committees throughout the parish to encourage everyone to incorporate this theme of "Becoming One" in their planning and work.

During this holy season of Advent, as we prepare the Way of the Lord in our lives, our parish, our city, our nation, and our world, we ask that you prayerfully consider joining in this essential work of reconciliation and unity. We now find ourselves in a time of unprecedented judgment and fear, but also, therefore, of an extraordinary opportunity to live our Gospel values more fully. More than ever, we must join together to birth God's love into our suffering nation and world.

Our faith tradition has always incorporated periods of prayer and fasting before major feast days, and so we are asking everyone to consider participating in a time of pre-Christmas Fasting and Prayer, from Sunday December 19 through Thursday December 23. During this time we will pray for the healing of all divisions among us, and for the healing and unity of our parish, our city, our nation, and our world. Fr. Sy and Fr. Joe will be providing more detail on this.

We also ask that you discern your call to the ministry of Reconciliation and Unity, and let us know if you are interested by writing your name on the Sign up sheet in the back of church before Christmas. We will begin our work in 2017 with a day-long retreat on Saturday January 14.


