Since 1992, St. Vincent de Paul has collaborated with other congregations of the Romero Interfaith Center to work for justice with peace in El Salvador, especially for those in our sister community of Las Anonas de Santa Cruz.

A fund was recently created to assist in addressing life-threatening environmental issues in the region, brought on by climate change and sugar cane production, through advocacy and popular education. <u>Take Action!</u> Please Support the BRIDGE Act and Protect DACA Youth: Send this JFI action alert in support of immigrant youth

The BRIDGE (Bar Removal of Individuals who Dream and Grow our Economy) Act, S.128/H.R. 496, was recently introduced in Congress as a bipartisan effort to sustain the temporary relief from deportation and employment eligibility offered to youth through the Department of Homeland Security's Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program. Under the BRIDGE Act, young people who came to the United States as children would maintain their eligibility to work and live in the U.S. without the fear of deportation and family separation so long as they meet certain requirements, such as showing a commitment to education or honorable service in our military and having no history of serious crime.

There are more than 750,000 young people who have received and benefitted from DACA. These youth entered the U.S. as children and know America as their only home. They are contributors to our economy, veterans of our military, academic standouts in our universities, and leaders in our parishes and communities. As Catholics, we have long supported DACA youth and their families as we believe in protecting the dignity of every human being, especially that of our children.

Ask your Senators and Representative to support and co-sponsor the BRIDGE ACT by sending the following message:

Dear Senator/Representative,

As a Catholic I write to express my strong support for the "Bar Removal of Individuals who Dream and Grow our Economy (BRIDGE) Act," S.128/H.R. 496. The BRIDGE Act protects the dignity of DACA-eligible youth by ensuring that these individuals, who were brought to the United States as children and are contributing so much to our nation, can continue to live their lives free of the anxiety that they could be deported at any time to a country they do not know and separated from their families.

I urge you to:

• Support and co-sponsor the BRIDGE Act (S.128/H.R. 496); and

• Continue to work towards larger legislative reform of our immigration laws. The Catholic community stands with you in support of the BRIDGE Act and vows to work with you to reform our immigration system in a humane and common-sense manner.

SAINT VINCENT'S COMMUNITY HAS SPOKEN ON IMMIGRATION

On Saturday and Sunday the 21st and 22nd of January, the congregation of Saint Vincent de Paul's Church voted to adopt the "Proclamation of Justice for Refugees and Immigrants," rejecting the policies of exclusion proposed by President Trump during his candidacy, and affirming the human dignity of undocumented immigrants in the United States. We received 258 YES and 13 NO votes, or roughly 95% positive to 5% negative. We could not feel more grateful for this level of support.

We still do not know where this proclamation will take us, but we feel stronger in unity with you as we respond to immigrant workers-- men, women, and their children. The testimony offered by your vote is invaluable, first of all, for immigrants who will count on your solidarity. It may also open the doors of other communities of faith as we ask them to join us in demanding fair treatment of immigrants. It may be publicized strategically so that many more people, including those in positions of power, will know that there is widespread resistance to the President's proposed course of action. It may enable us to be in touch with immigrants who may need our help in Germantown and the North West of Philadelphia. More than ever, Saint Vincent's community and its expressed commitment will guide the work of the New Sanctuary Committee. We look forward to the joint venture that this proclamation opens for all of us.


