

COULD YOU OR SOMEONE YOU KNOW BENEFIT FROM DAILY HOME DELIVERED MEALS?

Who is eligible to receive meals from Chestnut Hill Meals on Wheels?

Any person residing in the following zip codes - 19031, 19038, 19075, 19118, 19119, 19150, 19444, and a portion of 19144.

- A senior (62 or older) no matter what their physical health
- Any person of any age whose disability makes it difficult to shop for food and prepare meals without assistance.

What comprises a daily delivery?

Each daily delivery consists of

- cold lunch sandwich (choice of bread), salad, fruit, juice or milk, homemade dessert
- hot dinner soup, dinner (vegetable, starch, protein or pasta/meat), milk or juice, homemade dessert. Soups and entrées are in microwaveable containers.

How much does it cost? How do I pay?

These 2 meals cost \$9.00/day. One meal costs \$4.50 a day.

Clients are asked to pay a \$90 *fully refundable* deposit at the start of service. This deposit will be applied to your final invoice. If there is no balance at the time you suspend service, the full amount will be refunded to you.

Clients receive invoices during the first week of each month covering payment for all meals received during the prior month. They may give payment directly to volunteers at a future delivery or may mail payment in self-addressed envelope accompanying the invoice. Cash, checks or money orders are acceptable methods of payment. We do not accept credit card payments.

What if I don't need meals everyday?

Meals are available for delivery every weekday and you may choose to get delivery on any or all of those days. We do not currently deliver on weekends.

We ask that you sign up for a minimum of a two-week period. Emergency, shorter-term deliveries will be accommodated.

What time is the delivery?

Volunteers will deliver your food between 10 am and Noon on the days you have scheduled.

What if I'm not home when the meal is delivered?

If you will not be home at the time of delivery, you may place a small, sealed cooler with an ice pack outside your door and our volunteers will leave your meal in that container. We ask that you put your name on the cooler if you live in an apartment. If it's possible to notify us beforehand, we will be able to advise your volunteer driver that you will not be home.

What if I go on vacation or am away from home for other reasons?

You are always able to suspend delivery for any period of time you wish and for any reason. If you provide us with a 24-hour notice, you will not be charged for that day's meals. Simply call our office (215.233.5555) to notify us as to the dates you do not want/need delivery.

Can I order from a menu?

While we attempt to accommodate food allergies, we cannot provide for every individual food preference. So, typically there is one lunch item and one dinner item featured each day. Menus rotate over a 2-3 week period. Our menus are planned with popular items in mind so we are confident that clients will always enjoy the meals.

Do you deliver on holidays? In bad weather?

If a holiday falls on a weekday, you can expect delivery on that day or the day prior.

We make every attempt to deliver in bad weather but if the Springfield schools are closed, we will likely suspend delivery. However, if we are aware a storm is approaching, we may deliver meals on the day prior to the storm.

"I am the Bread of Life" (John 6:35)

Experiencing the presence of the risen Jesus at a meal, Eucharistic or not, is the takeaway message for today. How well do we prepare and enjoy our meals—Eucharistic or not? Fast food service is not the experience we want to bring to our table of fellowship. Slow food is better: planning, shopping, preparing, arranging, gathering with family and friends, telling stories, bonding, looking forward to life together away from the table. Meals, whether religious or social, signify acceptance and commitment. Sharing a meal says, "I want to be more a part of your life, and I want you to be part of mine." That's communion.

Jesus invites us to feed on him, that is, to draw his life into our own. If it is true that we are what we eat, then whoever eats his flesh and drinks his blood must in turn become a source of the grace received—a community grounded in love, service, nonviolence, and mutual emancipation. Meals give way to mission. The Eucharist is not complete until we bond with one another, fulfilling the commandment to love one another, one neighbor at a time. Bon appétit.

One neighbor at a time, or maybe four, six, or eight! We want to have dinners together because we really want to become a community of friends. We want to get to know each other better, and the best way to do that is to sit at the table just to enjoy each other's company around good food and conversation. We propose to have dinners where members of the parish sign up for a meal without knowing who their hosts are, or even who the other guests will be, except for one other person if you want to go as a pair. We will start in June, and we hope by the fall everybody will be signing up enthusiastically as hosts or guests. The mechanics of how this will work will be explained next week. Meanwhile, if you are willing to host a blind dinner, please place a card with your name, some possible dates, and how many people you can host, but do it secretly! You will call your mystery guests and give them details. Perhaps ask them to contribute a simple dish, bread, or an appetizer for the meal. Perhaps just bring their appetites and their good will. It is very likely that we will all make new friends, and that our Parish will become stronger, a true people in communion.
