STANDING WITH THE TREE OF LIFE SYNAGOGUE

We grieve the loss of our neighbors and fellow worshippers at Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh as we condemn, once again, the hate and gun violence tearing apart our communities. Our common enemies of white supremacy and white nationalism act as the fronts of a perfect storm surrounding those terrified by the oncoming waves of change and justice.

The resiliency of marginalized communities and our continued strides toward collective liberation terrifies those shielded by privilege and causes them to act violently encouraged by a President who encourages fear, hatred, and intimidation as appropriate forms of self-expression. These continued attacks on our communities are egregious forms of violence that impact our collective psyches, spirits, and systems as a whole. For centuries faith communities across the nation have experienced this kind of terror, where our churches, synagogues, and mosques have been bombed and our people killed, but time and time again we have fought back and won. Just as waves of hate are still ever so present, so is the resounding message that hate will not win. We refuse. What is meant to terrorize us, silence, us, and intimidate us, has further affirmed our commitment to fighting for justice for all of God's people.

We cannot and will not stand by silently as hate manifests in any corner of our country. It is up to us remember that each of us is a child of the Divine. It will be up to us to remember that we are one another's keeper and that we must stand in the breach between love and hate, between life and death. We are one. We are a community filled with people who look unmasked hate directly in the eye and boldly proclaim that it's time to boldly hold love over fear. Although we are heartbroken, we continue the faithful resistance against hate and pray for those who alienate themselves from love by dehumanizing our people.

Nothing about white nationalism flows from the heart of God. May we all say and live a resounding NO to any form of anti-Semitism, white supremacy, white nationalism, racism, bigotry, and discrimination.

So we mourn today but we fight tomorrow. We fight with boldness and courage until that day, as MLK said, where all God's children, black children and white children, Jews and Gentiles, Protestants and Catholics, Asians and Latinos, can live out the old black spiritual Free at Last, Free at Last, thank God almighty, we are free at Last.



Celebrate African Catholic Saints and Ancestors

St. Martin de Porres was born in Lima, Peru on December 9, 1579. Martin was the illegitimate son to Spanish nobleman Juan De Porres and an emancipated African woman Ana Velasquez from Panama. At a young age, Martin's father abandoned him, his mother and his younger sister, leaving Martin to grow up in deep poverty. After spending just two years in primary school, Martin was placed with a barber/surgeon where he would learn barbering and the medical arts.

As Martin grew older, he experienced a call to serve God in community. In Peru, by law, all descendants of African or Indians were not allowed to become full members of religious orders. Martin, who spent long hours in prayer, found his only way into the community he longed for was to ask the Dominicans of Holy Rosary Priory, in Lima. to accept him as a volunteer who served the other brothers in the monastery. In return, he would wear the habit and live with the religious community. When Martin was 15, he asked for admission into the Dominican Convent of the Rosary in Lima and was received as a servant and eventually became the church officer in charge of distributing money to deserving poor.

At the convent, Martin took on his old trades of barbering and healing. He also worked in the kitchen, did laundry and cleaned. After eight more years, Martin took his vows as a member of the Third Order of Saint Dominic, under the prior Juan de Lorenzana, who decided to disregard the racist law restricting Martin's profession of vows.

Martin became a Dominican lay brother in 1603 at the age of 24. Ten years later, Martin was assigned to the infirmary where he would remain in charge until his

death. Martin was praised for his unconditional care of all people, regardless of race or wealth. He took care of everyone from the Spanish nobles to the enslaved.

Martin walked in the power of God. It is said he had many powerful gifts, including levitation, bilocation, healing, spiritual knowledge and an excellent relationship with animals. Martin also founded an orphanage for abandoned children and the formerly enslaved and was well known for raising dowries for poor girls wanting to marry. He was known to even pass through locked doors to help the sick. In January of 1639, when Martin was 60-years-old, he became suddenly ill, passing away on November 3, 1639.

St. Martin de Porres was beatified by Pope Gregory XVI on October 29, 1837 and canonized by Pope John XXIII on May 6, 1962.

He has become the patron saint of people of mixed race, innkeepers, barbers, public health workers and more. His feast day is November 3.

Mental Health First Aid Course

A Mental Health First Aid course will be held at St. Vincent's Parish.

Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is a public education program that teaches the skills needed to identify, understand and respond to signs of behavioral health challenges or crises. First aid is given until appropriate supports are received.

The Adult Mental Health First Aid course is appropriate for anyone over 18 years and older who wants to learn how to help a person experiencing a mental health related crisis or problem.

Topics include anxiety, depression, psychosis and addictions. Participants who complete the course receive a 3 year certification.

This course is offered free of charge by the City of Philadelphia and both sessions must be attended.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL CHURCH STARTS A FUND FOR REFUGEES

Who's it for?

A refugee is someone who has been forced to flee his or her country because of persecution, war, or violence. A refugee has a well-founded fear of persecution for reasons of race, religion, nationality, political opinion or membership in a particular social group. Currently the number of refugees accepted into the United States is 44,000, the smallest number since 1980 when the White House began putting caps on the numbers allowed annually.

But refugee status is not automatic. Officially recognized refugees and de facto refugees are not the same thing only because of politics. Our fund would serve anyone who fits the above definition whether they have been deemed so by the government or not.

Why's it necessary?

We feel there is a need for a fund because money is needed for ongoing and future projects. We want to give others in the parish an opportunity to help out when and where the need arises.

The Current Situation

- Some parishioners have begun giving support to the two families who are in sanctuary in FUMCOG (the United Methodist Church nearby).
- Others help a family from Honduras to buy food. They are not in sanctuary but are waiting to see if their request for refugee status is accepted. They live in Germantown.
- There is still a family in sanctuary at the Church of the Advocate at 18th and Diamond Streets. The family has been in sanctuary for almost a year.
- Some parishioners are aiding a Guatemalan man to get settled. He received a special visa after being incarcerated for 11 months.
