



What are we trying to accomplish?

Until the spring of 2016, Pennsylvania was one of only 3 states in the United States with no consistent formula for distributing state basic education dollars. This resulted in large disparities between districts, particularly districts with majority white students compared to those with more children of color.

In 2016, State legislators enacted a well-designed formula with bi-partisan support, a Fair Funding Formula. However, they established -by law- that only new money added to the education budget since 2015, is distributed according to the Fair Funding Formula. Therefore, the distribution of PA basic education funding remains unfair.

What is the Fair Funding Formula?

The formula adjusts the state's portion of school district funding according to characteristics which impact a district's ability to provide a full and appropriate education for the children they are committed to serve.

How did it the formula come about?

The characteristics and their respective weights in the Fair Funding Formula are the result of a year-long study by the 15-member Basic Education Funding Commission, which was created by the state legislature following pressure by a number of community advocates for good education. Hearings were held in locations across the state with testimony given by "experts" invited to testify by the commission members. Prior to the hearing held in Philadelphia, through planning a direct action and not backing down, the faith-based, community-organizing group POWER pressured the Commission to allow public testimony for the remainder of the hearings.

The resulting combination of factors agreed upon by the bi-partisan commission with community input provides a transparent and educationally-justified basis for distributing basic education funding.

In response to the commission's report, Pennsylvania's legislative bodies enacted the recommended fair funding formula. **BUT.. Only for "new money".**

The budgeted money is still distributed in the *non fair* way. At an optimistic rate of 3% increase of "new money" per year, it would take more than 22 years for even 50% of the budgeted money to be distributed fairly. There would **never** be 100% FAIR FUNDING.

Legislation for 100% Fair Funding: House Bill 961

All of the money, 100%, allocated for basic education funding must be distributed through the Fair Funding Formula to eliminate the years of racial bias in its distribution and ensure FAIR FUNDING for Education. Until it is, the funding will always be unfair. Ask your Representative to back HB 961!

THE FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT IN REAL LIFE

Chances are, as a former Catholic school child you once had to be able to list all the fruits of the Spirit. If you've forgotten them, Pentecost offers a chance to revisit them in a new way.

In fact, in Galatians 5, Paul speaks of a single fruit of the Spirit, manifesting through nine facets—much like segments of an orange. When our life in the Spirit is fruitful, all the facets are visible, and indeed, they overlap again and again.

Take a few minutes to reflect on the working of the Holy Spirit in your life. Are all the "segments" of the fruit present?



To love is to desire good for others. Whom do I love? To whom do I wish evil, and how can I change that?

Joy and Peace:

Is my spirit at peace? Am I joy-filled, or am I often angry, anxious, or at odds with others and the world? Do I take time to be still in the presence of God, the source of all joy and peace?

Patience:

Do I persist in the tasks to which I am called, even in the face of resistance? Do I fly off the handle when others try my patience?

Kindness:

Am I focused outward, ready to lend a sympathetic ear? Do I listen with an open heart to those whose experiences are different from my own?

Generosity:

Do I give people the benefit of the doubt, or do I default to negative judgment? Do I make tithing and charity a priority, or do I allow my own wants to swallow my income?

Faithfulness:

Do I talk behind other people's backs? Do I criticize friends or family in my heart without sharing my concerns? Am I faithful to God? Do I let derogatory or hurtful comments to or about other children of God go unchallenged, out of fear of conflict or judgment?

Gentleness:

When the inevitable irritations of the day arise, do I roll with the punches? Do I approach conflict in a way that seeks the best interests of everyone involved? When I discipline those under my authority, do I take a punitive approach, or one that helps us all grow into holier, healthier individuals?

Self-control:

Self-discipline touches so many areas of life: expressing anger, word choices in online interactions, scheduling, food consumption, spending habits, screen time, the use of physical powers, time management. Am I intentionally under control in the way I navigate the world?
